CONTACT SEMINAR BETWEEN SPANISH AND INDIAN UNIVERSITIES

Date: 8th July, 2024

The session commenced with the opening remarks and agenda presentation by Dr. Laura Santamaria, Vice Rector of International Relations and Linguistic Policy at the Autonomous University of Barcelona. She was joined by Pia Moret, Deputy Director of the Interuniversity Council of Catalonia; Jordie Marin, Technical Advisor at SEPIE (Spanish Internationalization Unit); Prof. Vinay Pathak, President of the AIU; and Prof. Javier Lafuente, Rector of the Autonomous University of Barcelona.

In the next session, Jordie Marin, Technical Advisor at SEPIE (Ministry of Science), discussed the vital role of innovation and universities in the internationalization of Spanish higher education institutions (HEIs). SEPIE oversees the Erasmus+ program and various international study initiatives. Its primary objectives are to promote collaboration, enhance the visibility of Spanish higher education, and attract talent to Spain. To support these goals, SEPIE has been organizing "Study in Europe" fairs for the past three years.

Dr. Pankaj Mittal, Secretary General of AIU, addressed the audience on the Indian perspective on education, highlighting significant reforms in higher education and AIU's initiatives to promote internationalization in higher education. She emphasized the importance of international rankings, outlining key global rankings, benchmarks for institutional performance, and the criteria used to assess them. Dr. Mittal provided insights into the current status of Indian universities in these rankings, identifying areas for improvement and the challenges they face in meeting global standards. She reaffirmed the Indian government's commitment to establishing world-class higher education institutions and pledged to implement measures that will enhance the global standing of Indian HEIs.

Mr. Luis de Barutell, ATD SEPIE, highlighted the various opportunities for student and faculty mobility, explaining how international credit mobility operates. He noted the consistent participation of Spanish universities in Erasmus+ mobilities and discussed ongoing online mobility projects developed in collaboration with Indian partners. Additionally, he addressed cooperation projects and capacity-building initiatives in higher education, outlining key elements for project development, including regional scope, areas of interest, priorities, and effective practices in capacity building and the Erasmus Mundus program. Erasmus Mundus is available to students worldwide who hold a first higher education degree or equivalent, offering scholarships of up to €1,400 per month.

After a brief coffee break, the next session focused on the role of universities in Catalonia.

Toni Bassaganyas, Project Manager at CERCA, discussed the research ecosystem in Catalonia, highlighting the collaboration among the 42 CERCA centers and the importance of creating winwin synergies. CERCA provides high-level coordination for the entire system.

Dr. Laura Santamaria, Vice Rector for International Relations and Linguistic Policy at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB), presented the intensive research programs being conducted across 11 disciplines at the university. She also explored potential areas for collaboration with Indian universities. Dr. Ivan Martinez from UAB further elaborated on the ongoing research initiatives at the institution.

Prof. Alok Chakrawal represented India and gave a vibrant presentation about the research ecosystem in India. Professor Chakrawal provided a comprehensive overview of India's research ecosystem, highlighting its academic landscape, policies, achievements, and future goals. He emphasized the significant progress of Indian universities, noting their upward trajectory in global rankings such as the QS World University Rankings 2025. This progress is supported by initiatives under the National Education Policy 2020, PM-USHA, AIM, UAY, and IMPRINT, aimed at fostering research and innovation.

Key areas identified for research focus, Professor Chakrawal elaborated, include agriculture, aerodynamics, semiconductor industry, communication technology (5G/6G), quantum computing, cyber security, defense, healthcare, biotechnology, green technologies, artificial intelligence, digital infrastructure, and space technology. These sectors benefit from robust support from national research laboratories and institutions like ISI, ICAR, IAS, ICMR, ISRO, TIFR, HAL, VECC, NIAB, and PRL.

Over the past five years, India has seen a notable increase in PhD degrees awarded and research publications, particularly in cutting-edge fields. The country has also experienced a surge in intellectual property applications and patents granted, reflecting growing innovation. This academic prowess has bolstered India's position in global rankings, notably ranking 40th on The Global Innovation Index (GII) among 132 economies.

Professor Chakrawal underscored India's role as a global hub for R&D, driven by reforms in education, the commercialization of research, and strategic planning. He highlighted advancements in space technology, medical research, and defense capabilities, emphasizing their contributions to national development and global recognition. Furthermore, he discussed initiatives fostering startups and innovation across various sectors, supported by conducive policies and investments.

In conclusion, Professor Chakrawal outlined India's vision to consolidate its status as a leader in research and development, aiming for sustained growth through comprehensive reforms and strategic initiatives. He expressed his conviction that expansion of these with reaching out and collaborations will yield benefits for India and Spain and even for the whole world.

Given the challenges students often face in obtaining visas for Spain, the following session addressed visa procedures. Luis Alberto Solis Navarro from the Consulate of Spain in New Delhi and Jorge Benitez from UAB provided valuable information about the visa process and highlighted the International Support Services available to students at UAB.

Seven Spanish universities participated in the networking seminar, University of Vigo, Universitat de Barcelona, University Abat Oliba CEU, Universita Autonoma de Barcelona, Universitat Politecnica de Catalunya, UIC Barcelona and Obreal Global.

Networking Seminar between Spanish and Indian Universities

Master of Ceremony: Jordi Marín Badenes, technical advisor at the Spanish National Public Agency (SEPIE)

9.00 a.m. to 9.25 a.m.

The welcome address was delivered by José Aurelio Llaneza, Director of the Internationalization Unit, SEPIE, who spoke on Spanish Service for the Internalization of Education. In his address he emphasized internationalization of higher education and in this context he reiterated the need for more tie-ups between Indian and Spanish higher education institutions. He also spoke about the possibility of research collaborations between 26 Spanish and 23 Indian universities.

Prof. Vinay Pathak, President, Association of Indian Universities, the next speaker, threw light on the role AIU is playing to bring qualitative change in Indian higher education and to forge partnerships with institutions outside India. He also urged the Indian ambassador to Spain, Shri Dinesh Patnaik and his Spanish counterpart to facilitate such partnerships for education between India and Spain.



In her address, Irene Martín, Vice-Rector for Internationalisation, Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (UAM), expressed hope for a better collaboration with Indian universities.

Ambassador of India to the Kingdom of Spain, His Excellency Shri Dinesh K Patnaik, appreciated the efforts made by Dr (Mrs) Pankaj Mittal, Secretary General of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), in making the event possible. He expressed the view that higher education is all about directing youth towards their goals. In the context of India-Spain partnership in the field

of education, he pointed out that one important reason for less number of Indian students in Spain is that the majority of programmes in Spain are running in Spanish. In other words, courses in English are less. Efforts need to be made in this regard. He gave expectation that in years to come Spanish would become the most spoken language in the world. In order to attract Indian students, Spain would need to work on issues related to visas for Indian students.

In an exchange of views, Mr. Emilio de Miguel, Director of Casa Asia's Centre in Madrid and Ambassador-at-Large for the Indo-Pacific supported the view for greater interaction between Spanish and Indian academia and said that such interaction would be socially and culturally enriching, too. On his part, he said that he was impressed by courses on Yoga and by Indian culture. He underlined the importance of Indian diaspora in Spain.

9:25 a.m. – 9:45 a.m.: Spanish and Indian Universities in World Rankings

The first speaker of the session was Fátima Terol, Deputy Head of the Spanish Internationalisation Unit at SEPIE who spoke on Spanish Universities' performance in the main international rankings. She gave an overview of the Spanish university system with 93 universities, 43 of which are public universities and 50 private, comprising of 1000 faculty and a noteworthy number of schools. She elaborated on how these universities are setting academic standards and some of them belong to the highest-performing group.



Dr Pankaj Mittal, Secretary General of AIU was the next speaker. Dr Mittal focused on Indian Universities' performance in the main international rankings. She started with giving some facts about India, which makes the higher education needs for India diverse and unique. In spite of catering to these, Indian universities have shown remarkable performance in world ranking. She also highlighted the concerted efforts AIU has been making in this regard and that it would celebrate its centenary year in 2025.

9:45 a.m. – 10:05 a.m.: Good practices in university cooperation between Spain and India: A few Case Studies

Matilde Delgado Chauton, Director International Relations and Mobility Service, UAM, was the first speaker of the session. Her address was on A4U Network and Cooperation with India. She elaborated on how A4U (Alliance for Universities) has been instrumental in funding the exchange of Indian and Spanish staff and students, securing more Erasmus+ funding for exchange. These efforts, Ms Chauton stressed, have especially helped candidates from disadvantaged backgrounds and led to cooperation in teaching and research, with increase in the number of international students and staff, which in turn contributes to diversity and internationalization.

The last speaker of the session was Professor Neelima Gupta, Dr Harisingh Gour Sagar Central University of India. Professor Gupta spoke about the best practices in internationalization by India.

10:05 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.: International Evaluation Service of the Spanish Language (SIELE)

Agustina Francisco, SIELE Sales and Marketing Manager, covered this session. She extended her welcome to everyone in the Spanish-speaking world, the opportunities for higher education and career which knowledge of Spanish can provide, and gave information about certification systems

of Spanish proficiency, in particular about SIELE, the Servicio Internacional de Evaluación de la Lengua Española which certifies electronically the command of the Spanish language proficiency for students and professionals.

10:30 a.m. - 11:15 a.m. Coffee Break.

11:15 a.m. – 1:55 p.m.: Qualifications Recognition Practices in India

Mr Kuldeep Dagar, Joint Secretary AIU, spoke in this session about the issues of equivalence of degrees in the context of Indian and Spanish education systems.

In the closing session, Mr Dinesh Patnaik, Indian Ambassador to Spain had an interaction with the Indian delegation. One important point emerging out of the discussion was to bring improvement in the hostel facilities for foreign students which would lead to more number of students getting attracted for study abroad and student exchange programs. Consensus was also reached on starting a Yoga certification program, which would bring to the fore the ancient knowledge tradition of India. another point of discussion was upgrading the training system whereby the students and teachers from India can be ready to give their best and to procure the best in an international scenario. A related point of discussion focused on the need for more synergized efforts in extending the quality and reach of education consultancy.
